H Snap Shot of LPMBC's History

One hundred fifty-six years ago in the summer of 1868; five years after the Emancipation Proclamation and three years following the Civil War, the Reverend Larry A. Thompson, an itinerant preacher appeared suddenly and organized the Lake Providence Missionary Baptist Church. Reverend Thompson realized that to sustain the togetherness of members and the increased growth of the membership, a more permanent "place of worship" was needed. Six months from the time of Reverend Thompson's arrival, the first edifice of Lake Providence Missionary Baptist Church (described as a small box church) was built. Reverend Thompson served the congregation for approximately eighteen months and moved to the Indian Territory to further spread the word of God.

Before his departure, he named the community and church Lake Providence "because of a stream of water that flowed through the area." He believed it was the divine providence of God that led him into this community. Several months following Reverend Thompson's departure, another minister by the name of Reverend Manuel Stepped into the breach to hold the congregation together for a brief period and later resigned. Church records indicate that he was succeeded by numerous probationary ministers.

On November 6, 1931 in a special call meeting Reverend Dr. Samuel Henry Simpson was elected Pastor of the Lake Providence Missionary Baptist Church. He served this church diligently for forty- four years until ill health prevailed. During his pastorate, he made significant strides for Lake Providence, and will always be remembered in the hearts of those that knew him.

Following the passing of Reverend Simpson, Lake Providence called her own son, the Reverend H. Bruce Maxwell to assume the responsibilities as Pastor. He was installed and licensed to preach on November 14, 1976. With Pastor Maxwell leading the way, our church family has been blessed with an upsurge of growth. On November 13, 1988, a groundbreaking ceremony was held and the construction of the past edifice began. On October 22, 1989, Pastor Maxwell along with 600 congregants marched into the 4506 Nolensville Road location. As God continued to bless, the mortgage was retired and a Mortgage Burning Service was held on July 23, 1995 to commemorate satisfaction of that debt.

Space challenges continued to confront the congregation. Although we had only occupied the 4506 location for a brief period, the phenomenal growth that occurred since occupancy limited the church's ability to adequately serve the membership and community. An exhaustive study of expanding the past facility occurred. Despite this effort, it became quite clear that challenges associated with this site would not be feasible the church family was polled to determine their preference and voted overwhelmingly to relocate. 'Empowered with this charge, the difficult task of locating suitable property to erect a worship facility began. As the members of our church family continued to pray like the saints of old, thirty-six acres of land located approximately two miles south of the 4506 location were presented to the congregation as the future home of the Lake Providence Missionary Baptist Church.

On May 25, 2001, the official groundbreaking service was held and construction of our new edifice began. On Sunday, February 9, 2003 services of dedication were held for our new "house of worship." The ultimate completion of this endeavor was held on Sunday, July 27, 2003 with the laying of the cornerstone. Although a portion of the vision has been realized, Pastor Maxwell still believes there is substantial work that remains.

Enhancement of current ministries and the establishment of new services/facilities to better serve the congregation and community is a priority. The possibility of adding a Family Life Center which would include a gymnasium is included in the long range plan. The board also continues to explore the feasibility of developing a school.

On April 21, 2011, the 4506 location was sold to Debre Keranio Medhanialem Ethiopian Orthodox Tewahedo Church. While it saddened us to finalize this transaction, we were overjoyed at the enhanced ministry opportunities that these liquid funds present. Psalm 127: 1 {NKJV} reminds us, "Unless the Lord builds the house, they labor in vain who build it." The historic Lake Providence Missionary Baptist Church is the "House of the Lord."

As we conclude our glimpse into the past, let us not forget the men and women who worked tirelessly to make sure that the foundation of Lake Providence was not only materially sound, but spiritually strong as well. It is through their efforts, contributions and the foundation they laid that we have "come this far by faith."



About Our Pastor

Pastor H. Bruce Maxwell

It is evident that God had a special place for H. Bruce Maxwell, the fourth child of the late Reverend Henry C. Maxwell, Sr., and Flora Jordan-Maxwell. He received his elementary and secondary education in the Davidson County Public Schools, and furthered his academic pursuits at the Emmanuel Bible College and Seminary, obtaining both the Bachelor and Master of Theology degrees.

Never having been one to be satisfied with the ordinary, he accepted Jesus Christ as his personal savior at an early age, and was baptized into the Lake Providence Missionary Baptist Church. He served diligently under the tutelage of Reverend Dr. Samuel H. Simpson as an Associate Minister. Following the passing of Reverend Simpson, he was overwhelmingly endorsed as pastor.

He delivered his first sermon on June 30th, and shortly thereafter, he was licensed to preach the "Word of God." In the forty-eight years since he was called to lead the people of Lake Providence, Pastor Maxwell has assumed the mantle of both preacher and teacher. He has endeavored to foster an understanding that God's people cannot exist in a vacuum; there must be communion between pastor, people and the Holy Spirit. Under his leadership, Lake Providence has accomplished much and experienced tremendous growth numerically, spiritually, and financially, but the best is yet to come!

Pastor Maxwell has a passion for preaching, and believes in equipping the saints with the armor they need to live full spiritual lives. Presently, and in addition to his duties as pastor of the historic Lake Providence Missionary Baptist Church, he has served in various capacities at Southern Hills Medical Center, the Nashville Chamber of Commerce, and Belmont University.

Pastor Maxwell is the proud husband of Mrs. Evon Maxwell; father to daughters, Michelle, Courtney, and PaPa to McKensey, Morgan, and Trey.
